10 Year Anniversary in Cambodia

In December 13 supporters took off from Melbourne Airport on an eightday trip to Siem Reap to be part of the 10-year celebrations of Growing Cambodia. They were joined by 7 other supporters who made their separate ways from various places including Queensland and Singapore. At a dinner organised by the local managers for all the teachers and university students the supporters relaxed and enjoyed meeting our wonderful local team face to face. Each teacher and university student were formally acknowledged by a member of the travelling group. Certificates of Appreciation and gifts for 10 Years of Service were presented to Sopheak Phay, Vattey Ouch, Sovann Kay and Ms Ratha Som for their incredible contributions over the journey.

During the trip the group visited the 4 villages and schools supported by Growing Cambodia. There they were taken on a tour of each village before playing games with the students, helping in the classrooms, and organising art classes.

There was also plenty of time for shopping for local products and seeing the sights – including watching the sunrise at Angkor Watt (Tick on Bucket List) and a trip to Battambang for a ride on a train! We also visited a local partner – Eco Soap – who supply soap to our students and schools. Eco Soap now employs 40 local women on a full-time basis – it was amazing to see this enterprise in operation that has also changed the lives of many women.

Local restaurants were visited with the highlight being dinner at The Haven where locals are trained for the hospitality industry – the food and service was incredible – well done to The Haven as well for changing people's lives for the better.

A final thank-you to Sopheak and Vattey for organising and looking after us so well and to all the supporters who travelled to Cambodia. Eight days passed so quickly. However new lifelong friendships were formed, and our first-time visitors now have a better understanding of what Growing Cambodia does and how it operates.

Operational Update

New Classes and Classrooms

The start of 2023 has seen 2 new classes commence at Kok Beng with 3 new classes being added at Beng. The classes at Beng are being taught in a new classroom which was opened on 12 December – 10 years to the day after the first building at Oroluos opened for classes.

The classroom was built in memory of Pat Giles, Growing Cambodia's oldest volunteer, with the funds being donated by her son Stephen. Thank you, Steve, for such a wonderful gesture for both your mother and the children in the Beng community – we are sure your Mum would have been honored and proud of your generosity.

More exciting news occurred at Koy Meng where free English classes are being offered to secondary school students for the first time. Students in Years 7, 8 and 9 can now learn English with the expansion of our program in this community.

Growing Cambodia is now offering free English lessons to over 1000 children in the four rural Cambodian communities we currently support.









Operational Update (cont)

New Teachers

With additional classes at the schools, we have been very fortunate to welcome 3 more wonderful teachers to our Team:

- Ms Hong Chantry comes to us with an excellent background having studied at USEA in Siem Reap and then the Battambang Teacher Education College and CUS BMC as a trainee teacher. Ms Chantry has been teaching English since 2019 at Sras Reang Secondary School. Ms Chantry will be teaching the Years 7,8 and 9 students at Koy Meng.
- Mr. Uonn Orn joins us at Beng. Mr Orn is a former student of Oroluos and has just obtained a Bachelor degree from the University of Battambang. Welcome back!
- Mr. Samnang has started at Kok Beng where he is teaching 2 classes between 5.30pm and 7.30pm each evening. Mr Samnang also teaches at Stepping Stones, just down the road, during the day.

Thank you to our three new teachers and we wish you all the best.

There are now 13 local teachers conducting our classes and working with our managers Sopheak Phay and Vattey Ouch to deliver daily lessons to the students.

University Sponsorships

We currently have eleven students attending University. The percentage of secondary students going on to obtain University degrees is extremely low in Cambodia mainly due to affordability. You can help a student attend a University in Siem Reap and give them an opportunity to obtain qualifications that will help them earn a higher income. The cost to support a student at university is between \$700-\$1,000 per annum.

"Fill the Bag" Scholarships

You might also like to contribute to a scholarship that allows disadvantaged students to attend a government school. Without this support, these children would not receive any education whatsoever!

The cost to "Fill the Bag" of a student and send them off to school for one year is \$70.00 – this includes the cost of a uniform, a school bag, an exercise book and other stationery.
