## Kawana Waters State College off to Cambodia again!

Growing Cambodia has been extremely fortunate in having the ongoing support of Kawana Waters State College on the Sunshine Coast since 2018. In September of that year a group of students and teachers first volunteered at our schools. The students and school community have organised fundraising activities every year since. We were thrilled when Lyn Duffy, who puts an incredible amount of work into making both the visits and fundraising happen, joined our committee this year. Lyn takes up the story

In 2023, Kawana Waters State College were finally able to repeat their trip to Cambodia from 2018. COVID put a stop to the trip planned for 2020 and last year was the first time the Queensland Department of Education lifted their ban on international travel for students. We took a group of 31 students and 5 staff. This year we are even bigger with 30 students, 7 staff and 3 volunteer family members of staff, in total 40 participants.

#### Preparation

Weekly meetings have already begun for participants in preparation for the trip in June. The students are excited and looking forward to this adventure. The group also includes 2 staff and 3 students who went in 2023.

Our preparation always begins a term before the trip. Our meeting timetable for this year is to the right.

#### **Health students and Days for Girls**

Our College is located quite close to the Sunshine Coast University Hospital. We have a partnership with the hospital, and we employ 6 qualified nurses/educators who offer Health certificates for our students in Years 10, 11 & 12. In conjunction with the health program and our trip to Cambodia, health students are asked to complete the online training in the Days of Girls education. We work with the local Days for Girls group and collect donations of face washers and girls' underwear, which is used for kits that are sent to countries such as Fiji. We then raise money to buy kits in Cambodia to distribute at GC supported schools. Last year we raised funds to purchase in Cambodia 700 kits and presented the education program to over 100 girls in Koy Meng Secondary School.




#### **Donations**

#### The Cambodia Trip

After settling into our hotel and a few days of tourist activities including Phare circus, Eco Soap, Floating village and of course Angkor Wat, we ventured out to the schools.

Because we are such a large group, we divide up into smaller groups

for school visits. Some to Beng Village, some to Oroluos and some to Kok Beng. Then on the following days we rotate. On the day we go to Koy Meng, we go all together.

At Koy Meng our Health students ran the Days for Girls program.

Other students focused on teeth cleanliness education and effective hand washing awareness games.

We also took donations to Koy Meng Health Clinic and Oroluos District Hospital.



At Beng Village School, Oroluos School and Kok Beng School we have a few different approaches.

- Sometimes teaching the whole class and following the topics the teachers are working on at that time.
- Often teaching a concept to a small group in whatever space we can find.

We try to demonstrate how teaching can occur through games and fun activities. Last year our student made Snap and Bingo card games. We gave them a template and they had to make the game and then we laminated it and cut them up ready to use. This worked really well and the Cambodian teachers could see how this helped with vocabulary and English reading skills. It was also a lot of fun for the Cambodian children.

Each of our students also published a book about themselves showing photos of their homes, classrooms, hobbies, favourite foods etc. They shared these with the children in Cambodia and left them for the schools to use.

Sometimes just playing with the children and in this way also teaching English. We teach our students to be very repetitive. By using the same phrases over and over in a game we can teach the language of the game.

We also did some eye tests and donated a whole lot of prescription glasses that were donated to us by Spec Savers Maroochydore!

And we filled the storeroom at Oroluos!























#### Our community project

We raised money in Australia for the community project by selling frozen cordial cups to our primary campus students at the end of the day. That helped us to buy the materials and to hire experienced locals to guide us. Last year we built gardens at Beng Village and Oroluos Schools. We also dug out the swings at Beng Village and installed new ones. Thank goodness the ice-cream man came because we really needed him after all the hard work and sweat!

## New Multi-purpose building at Beng

Following on from the generous support from Stephen Giles for the construction of a classroom at Beng a new sponsor has committed funds for the building of a library/computer training/administration building at the same school.

Steven Kastrinakis and his fellow directors from the Independent Pharmacies of Australia group are the incredibly generous sponsors for this project. Construction has already begun with the planned opening for the building being on 6 May. Steven and other company representatives and friends will travel to Cambodia for the opening along with some Growing Cambodia committee members.

Not only has the company itself committed funds but both employees and suppliers are also raising money. These donations will be used to buy computers for the new computer training classroom and a minibus to transport students who live further away. The minibus will also make it safer for students to travel home at night.

It is planned that Beng will become a learning hub for the area and the use of the minibus will allow students from other villages to access these learning facilities.

## **Operational Update**

The start of 2024 has seen 31 classes being run at our 4 schools. The total number of students attending the classes at the end of January was 888 – comprising 346 boys and 542 girls.

At Oroluos school Ms Ratha, Ms Rathana, Mr Nin and Ms Veary – a new teacher – run 10 classes for 229 students.

Over at Beng Mrs Samphaos, Mrs Reaksa, Ms Srey Nith and Mr Orn share 9 classes involving 288 students – an increase in numbers from last year.

Mr Samnang and Mr Oudorm continue to run 2 evening classes each at the Kok Beng Primary school. Numbers here have also increased with 146 students normally in attendance.

At Koy Meng the classes are run both during the day and the evening. Ms Chantry, Ms Rany and Mr Chanthorn have 225 children in their 8 classes.

Thank you to our wonderful teachers and happy learning to all the students!

## Other ways you can help

#### Tertiary Sponsorships – become a Tertiary Patron!

We currently sponsor fifteen students attending various Universities in Cambodia. The number of students has increased this year due to the support of our Tertiary Patrons 2024. The percentage of secondary students going on to obtain University degrees is extremely low in Cambodia mainly due to affordability. You can help a student attend a University and give them an opportunity to obtain qualifications that will help them earn a higher income by becoming a Tertiary Patron. The cost to support a student at university for a Tertiary Patron is \$ 1000 per annum for 3 years. If you are interested, please contact us for further information.

This is the story of one student we are sponsoring this year -Nat is 19 years old. Her house is around 9km away from Beng school and near the lake. Her house is always flooded in the rainy season. She sometimes comes to school by boat with her friends. She has 2 brothers and 2 sisters. Her father is a fisherman. Because of the difficulty of her journey to school, her mother asked her friend to let Nat live with her. Sievhai lives and studies at the house of her mother's friend near Beng village. In the morning, she goes to study at the public school in the morning and come to study English with Ms Sreynit at Beng school in the evening. She has been learning English at Beng school for more than 4 years.

Nat was the only one in her village who graduated from high school last year. Her big ambition was to study at university, but her parents could not afford to pay. Nat decided to apply for sponsorship to study law at university. Nat will move to Siem Reap and rent a small room to live with her friend and find work there and hopefully fulfill her dreams.

#### "Fill the Bag" Scholarships

You might also like to contribute to a scholarship that allows disadvantaged students to attend a government school. Without this support, these children would not receive any education whatsoever!

The cost to "Fill the Bag" of a student and send them off to school for one year is \$70.00 – this includes the cost of a uniform, a school bag, an exercise book and other stationery.
